CONFERENCE DESCRIPTION

The scope and complexity of anesthesia care has dramatically increased along with the evolving landscape of perioperative medicine. New techniques, new drugs, new evidence, and new quality and safety concerns all play a role in today's practice environment. OPTIONAL AIRWAY WORKSHOP - Saturday, December 7th

Airway Workshop — Saturday, December 7th, 1:00pm - 4:30pm

The advanced airway workshop reviews emergency surgical airway techniques based on new evidence that has been collected since 2015. It offers hands-on training for emergency surgical airway access using a 3D-printed larynx model with fresh pig skin overlay or a fresh pig larynx and trachea preparation. Other workstations will include virtual reality bronchoscopic intubation simulation of normal and difficult airway anatomy, awake intubation made easy, preventing airway injuries, basic and advanced lung separation as well as direct and video laryngoscopy and bronchoscopy in various anatomic models. This hands-on workshop is open to all registered participants for an additional fee of \$200.
