- Understand appropriate procedures for activation of the 1-4-7 emergency response communication system.
- Develop and utilize the closed-loop communication technique to ensure understanding and completion of assigned tasks and responsibilities across professions.
- Improve personal comfort and confidence in the application and utilization of hospital-wide emergency equipment, policy, and procedures.
