Why should I take the Cultural Competence Mini-Series?

Additionally, you will enhance your skills and knowledge to work more effectively in a multicultural setting.

Who can take this course?

This course is open to all employees of the University of Chicago Medicine and Biological Sciences Division. All course graduates become Cultural Competence Advocates who serve as resources in meetings and in their departments.

Do I have to attend all 11 sessions?

In order to graduate from the course, you must attend all eleven sessions. We understand that schedules are often hectic so we offer multiple dates and times for each session. All sessions are stand-alone sessions meaning they all provide information and skill building. The facilitators will host a time for questions and feedback after each session. You can mix and match your sessions. At the same time, we do encourage you to take all 11 sessions.
