CONFERENCE DESCRIPTION

What's unique about this program?

This one-day curriculum on lung cancer education uniquely incorporates learner-centric elements:

1. Interactive “tumor board” sessions which encourage honest and anonymous audience participation using an electronic response system.
2. Team approach to lung cancer diagnosis, staging and management, which is performed using problem-based learning “Practical Approach” exercises.
3. Authentic learning experience pertinent to:
 - minimally invasive pulmonary nodule diagnosis
 - mediastinal and extra-thoracic staging, including EBUS-TBNA and mediastinoscopy
 - video-assisted and robotic surgery
 - conventional and stereotactic ablative radiotherapy
 - conventional and targeted chemotherapy and biological therapies
 - small volume specimen acquisition, pathology analysis, cytomorphologic diagnosis, and molecular markers relevant to lung cancer

How to prepare and what to expect from this program?

Preparation: This program applies the “flipped classroom” educational model. Minimal pre-summit work is administered online. The participants are expected to:

- Review the instructions on how to use learning managing system (LMS)
- Review the online lectures, videos & articles available in the LMS

Workflow at the summit

At the registration, participants are assigned to small groups representing different specialties.

Completion of a pre-test to assess baseline knowledge

Mock tumor board including an audience response system

Workgroup discussions and presentations

- * Apply a “four box” practical approach format to evaluate the assigned case scenario
- * Develop a patient-centered and evidence-based care for lung cancer management
- * Prepare a short power point presentation to share with all the participants

Completion of a post-test to assess knowledge gained

Interactive “Do it or Don't do it!” session to deliver “take home” messages

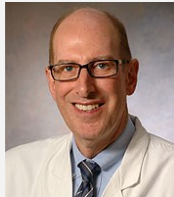
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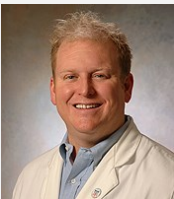
