Course Description

This one-day course will focus on state-of-the-art operative and office-based techniques and technologies for surgical treatment of laryngeal disorders. Attendees will also learn contemporary voice pathology strategies for evaluation and rehabilitation of patients with surgical voice disorders. The format will include lectures, panel discussions, and audience participation.

Objectives

At the conclusion of the course, participants will be able to:

- Explain techniques for optimal endoscopic laryngeal exposure and state-of-the-art surgical treatment of benign and malignant laryngeal pathology
- Describe the role of angiolytic lasers in operative and office-based laryngeal surgery
- 3. Identify strategies for office-based management of laryngeal pathologies
- Summarize techniques for enhancing preand post-operative voice rehabilitation and discover low-cost options for objective voice analysis
- 5. Discuss emerging technology in ambulatory monitoring of vocal function

Aaron D. Friedman, MD (course director) is a laryngeal surgeon and founder / director of the NSUHS Voice Center in Northbrook, IL. He also holds a Clinical Assistant Professorship from the University of Chicago Pritzker School of Medicine. Dr. Friedman attended medical school at Columbia University, College of Physicians & Surgeons and did his residency in Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery at the Cleveland Clinic. He completed a fellowship at the MGH Center for Laryngeal Surgery and Voice Rehabilitation in 2009. After his training, he was a practice partner of Dr. Zeitels before relocating to Chicago in 2012. Dr. Friedman has taught multiple courses, given many national presentations, and authored numerous peer-reviewed journal articles in the field of laryngology.



Christine Martin, MA, CCC-SLP is a voice pathologist who has worked for over 25 years rehabilitating patients' voices in the Chicago area. She is a classical pianist and has singing experience in both musical theater and choral music. Ms. Martin specializes in myofascial release for voice.



Meghann Olive, MS, CCC-SLP is a voice pathologist and a classically trained lyric soprano. She has performed extensively as a private recitalist and with opera and musical theater companies in New York City. Ms. Olive is well-trained in Alexander Technique.



Sweta Soni, MA, CCC-SLP is a voice pathologist and a classically trained soprano who continues to perform in the community. Steven M. Zeitels, MD, FACS is the Eugene Casey Professor of Laryngeal Surgery at Harvard Medical School and Director of the MGH Center for Laryngeal Surgery and Voice Rehabilitation. He is an international leader and prolific author in the field of laryngology and is widely regarded as a surgical innovator. He has developed novel laser applications to treat laryngeal epithelial diseases and has been a pioneer of office-based laryngeal laser surgery. Media venues have discussed the surgical and medical care of a number of Dr. Zeitels' celebrity patients including Adele, Julie Andrews, Steven Tyler (Aerosmith), Roger Daltrey (The Who), Sam Smith, Lionel Richie, Keith Urban, James Taylor and Joe Buck.



Daryush Mehta, PhD is Director of the Voice and Speech Laboratory at the MGH Center for Laryngeal Surgery and Voice Rehabilitation and an Assistant Professor of Surgery at Harvard Medical School. Dr. Mehta received his PhD in Speech Bioscience and Technology from Harvard University / Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) and his Master's degree in Electrical Engineering and Computer Science from MIT. Dr. Mehta's research interests include high-speed laryngeal imaging, speech signal processing, and clinical voice disorder assessment.

Lecture Highlight: Smartphone-Based Ambulatory Monitoring of Vocal Function

Dr. Mehta will discuss his research efforts to develop an ambulatory voice monitoring device, which can non-invasively quantify vocalization over days and weeks. This cutting-edge technology is providing much-needed insight into the role of phonotrauma in the development of laryngeal pathology, and it may change how we manage phonotraumatic voice disorders in the future.
