

This 27th Annual Course will provide a complete review of basic principles of orthopaedic care. Particular attention will be paid to the diagnosis and initial management of the orthopaedic problems most commonly seen by the primary care giver. Formal question and answer periods will follow each topic session, paneled by the faculty. We will feature daily "Spotlight Lectures" as related to current and hot topics on orthopaedic issues.

WORKSHOPS

1. Employ the physical exams of the hand, wrist, shoulder, spine, hip, knee, ankle, and foot to help determine the next steps in a patient's course of treatment;
2. Identify techniques to properly administer musculoskeletal injections;
3. Interpret orthopaedic x-rays and MRIs to diagnose patient issues;
4. Discuss how to overcome acute care challenges surrounding orthopaedic patients' post-surgical care.
5. Acquire knowledge of physical therapy techniques and approaches of various musculoskeletal body regions.
