Program Overview

This program presents topics relevant to perinatal healthcare for todays' healthcare professional.

Objectives: Learners will

- Recognize the components of a pediatric transport team and the importance of multidisciplinary team training
- Identify the various causes of neonatal encephalopathy, its presentation, and the benefit of being monitored and treated in a neonatal neurocritical intensive care unit.
- Explain the relationship between the establishment of a small baby unit and improved neonatal outcomes
- Recall normal physiologic changes that occur during pregnancy and review etiologies, diagnostic criteria and management strategies of sepsis in the obstetric patient
- Discuss the impact of birth trauma on maternal mental health and practices of trauma informed care
- Explain the impact of marijuana and kratom use during pregnancy
- Describe preterm birth, the public health impact, and the landmark trials/landscape surrounding prevention
- Determine available resources in Illinois to improve maternal and neonatal outcomes
