CONFERENCE DESCRIPTION

The field of Nutrition Support is a critical area of healthcare, particularly in the management of adult patients requiring specialized nutritional interventions. There exists a significant need for comprehensive educational opportunities in this field to address the complexities of both enteral and parenteral nutrition and the role of diet in disease management. Our conference seeks to fill this gap by providing a thorough introduction to Nutrition Support, tailored specifically for healthcare professionals involved in the care of adult patients. The need for such education is underscored by the evolving research, diverse patient needs, and the technological advancements related to the role of diet and nutrition in disease states. Through this conference, we aim to enhance the knowledge and skills of healthcare providers, ensuring they are well-equipped to deliver effective nutrition support and improve patient outcomes in various clinical settings.

The goal of the **John F. Gilmore Symposium on Nutrition and Small Bowel Disorders** is to introduce healthcare professionals to the field of nutrition support and increase awareness of the role of diet in disease management. We aim to equip attendees with the knowledge and skills necessary to address the unique nutritional needs of individuals with gastrointestinal disorders. The focus this year, in addition to enteral and parenteral nutrition support, will include disorders of the pancreas and small bowel. Through a blend of expert-led sessions and case studies, our conference will foster a deep understanding of the critical role nutrition plays in managing these conditions, and empower healthcare professionals to deliver optimal nutritional care.

TARGET AUDIENCE

This activity is designed for gastroenterologists, gastroenterology trainees, internists, advanced practice nurses, physician assistants, registered dietitians, nurses, and pharmacists dedicated to caring for patients with nutrition-related disorders.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

After this activity, participants will be able to:

- Identify basic initial recommendations for the management of malnutrition to provide to patients;
- Select the appropriate enteral feeding tube based on a patient's unique clinical condition;
- Describe techniques for managing physiologic intolerances to enteral nutrition support and mechanical complications of enteral access devices (e.g., leaking, clogged, and connection incompatibilities);
- Recommend the appropriate use of parenteral nutrition (PN) with an understanding of the basics of line choice and home monitoring;
- Describe the appropriate management of nutrition in patients presenting with acute and chronic pancreatitis;
- Describe the role of medical and nutrition-related therapies in eosinophilic gastrointestinal disorders;
- Understand the basics of carbohydrate absorption and the impact of malabsorption and medications on gastrointestinal symptoms.
